REPORT OF SELECTMEN ON PROPOSED ROAD FROM C. S. HIGLEY'S TO B. M. BAKER'S.

On August 19th, 1913, pursuant to the vote of the town at its last Annual Meeting, we inspected the proposed route and got estimates of cost to build road and the land damages. The cheapest we could get an estimate and bid to build road was \$700 and the town to furnish plank for the necessary bridges. The land damage was \$300. We estimated it would take at least 2,000 feet of plank for the bridges it would be necessary to build, and decided not to take the responsibility to lay out and open road

but to make this report to the voters and let them decide the matter.
