REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

TO THE VOTERS OF THE TOWN OF HUNTINGTON:

Herewith is submitted my third annual report as superintendent of schools. The statistics on transportation of pupils are as follows:

It will be noticed that the percentage of attendance for the past school year was excellent, being about three percent above the average for the state. This is due in no small degree to the interest of parents, children, teachers and school officials, and shows a good healthy spirit in the town.

During the past summer a ventilating heater was installed at the Center school. On this item the State pays one-third of the cost.

The Catherine E. Ross school has been given a name plate rating it as a standard school. On a basis of one hundred percent representing all that a rural school should have for equipment and school activity, this school rates 85 percent. The money for the improvement of this school was raised by the teachers and children.

A good school in a community is an asset to every property-holder. Real estate sells better where there are good schools. Whatever opportunities we can place before the children through good equipment in our schools is always a good investment.

At present the State will give one-third toward the cost

of repairing or standardizing a rural school. Each of the schools at the Center and Hanksville rates 41 percent and could stand improvement. I would therefore recommend that the town vote ten cents on each dollar of the grand list for the standardization of the Center school.

In all the schools the quality of the work is good and the children are making steady advancement in their grades.
