The number of children attending high schools in the State from this town last year was 14.

Soon after the close of school last June the Hanksville School house was struck by lightning. Only by the heroic work of the men and women of the community was the building saved. The damage to the building amounted to about \$400.

Electric lights have been installed in the Center School. These help the children's eyes on dark days and make the building more available for community use. It is hoped that the other school buildings will be wired as soon as convenient.

Early in the fall new swings were installed at all the schools. They help the teachers to maintain discipline in the schools by keeping the children happy, and free from quarreling. It is natural for children to play and playing is necessary for their growth and development. Play devices help to keep the activities of children clean and healthful.

A Parent-Teacher Association has been formed at the Lower Village. This organization has for its object the welfare of all the children in all the schools of the town. Anybody who is interested in children is urged and invited to join the Association.

All the school houses in town are now in excellent condition and with a good staff of teachers the school work is being carried on in an efficient way.
