## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the voters of the Town of Huntington:

Herewith is submitted my first report as superintendent of schools. It is a report for a part of the year only as my duties did not begin until July 1, 1935.

During the year one two-room school and two rural schools are being maintained with enrollments and percentages of attendance as follows:

Transportation seems to be one of the more expensive items in the operation of schools. This is due largely to the modern tendency to centralize and to the fact that some families live at a considerable distance from the schools.

During the past year 25 pupils were transported at a cost of \$382.51.

The school buildings are in very satisfactory condition with the exception of some repairs which ought to be made to the interiors. Most of them need redecorating. There is also need of additional equipment in all of them.

The townspeople may point with pride to the fact that all buildings have been standardized. The schools rank well with those in other towns.

Two new teachers were necessary at the beginning of the present school year. Miss Marcella Kendall of Chelsea, Vermont, was engaged to teach in the Hanksville School and Miss Eleanor Holmes of Johnson, Vermont, filled the vacancy in the Catherine Ross School.

A school system may have good buildings well equipped, but without teachers who are enthusiastic, sympathetic, and devoted to their work little can be accomplished. In securing the services of such teachers, the town has been very fortunate.

Few changes in the courses of study have been made. The outlines recommended by the State Board of Education have been followed. Some new texts in Geography were purchased this year.

Changes in other subjects should be made as soon as possible as many of the books in use are obsolete. They should be replaced with new and more modern editions.

I would suggest that new texts in at least one subject be purchased each year. In that way, no financial burden would be imposed upon the taxpayers, and in a few years new books would be placed in all the schools.

Nothing is more difficult for the teachers and more harmful to the children than to have them working with books which are not modern.

For the schools to be successful close co-operation between the parents, school officials, and teachers is necessary. I am pleased to know that such relations exist.

In conclusion, may I take this opportunity to express my appreciation for the very courteous co-operation which the townspeople and the members of the school board have given the teachers and me in our efforts to conduct the schools in an efficient manner.
