SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS REPORT

To the voters of the Town of Huntington:

Herewith is submitted my annual report as superintendent of schools.

During the year the following schools with corresponding enrollments have been maintained:

School	Enrollment
Catherine Ross Primary.....	38
Catherine Ross Grammar.....	34
Center School.....	22
Hansville	17

The percent of attendance in most schools has been good. It is very important that good attendance be maintained because the amount of money now received from the State is determined by the average daily attendance in each school. Absence of pupils now means a decrease in revenue to the town for school purposes. For this reason, parents should see that their children attend regularly unless they are physically unfit to attend.

The teaching force consists of four elementary teachers. One new teacher was necessary to fill a vacancy in the Hansville School. Miss Clara Riford, who had taught in this school before was engaged to replace Miss Marcela Kendall.

To retain teachers who are doing satisfactory work is something very beneficial to the schools, as very often new teachers mean changes in methods of instruction.

Transportation continues to be one of the more expensive items in the maintenance of schools. During the year thirty-two pupils have been transported at a cost of \$656.89. This may seem large in view of the fact that the money received from the State shows no rebate for transportation. The amount returned by the State is now included in the general fund.

As provided in the new educational laws passed by the last Legislature, all money received from the State is in the form of a general fund which includes rebate for

transportation, trained teachers supervision, advanced instruction and other items formerly listed separately. This change has brought relief to the smaller towns as they now receive more money for educational purposes.

The courses of study as outlined by the State Board of Education are being followed. New courses in the Social Studies have necessitated some changes in Geography and History. To meet the requirements of these new courses, new text books in these subjects have been necessary.

Achievement tests are being used in the schools as a method of determining the amount of progress each pupil makes each year. By the use of these tests, instruction may be applied more uniformly.

Two new duplicating devices have been added to the equipment of the schools. The Catherine Ross School purchased one with money which was given the school by the former Parent Teachers' Association. One was purchased by the school at the Center with funds which were earned by the school. With these duplicators the teachers are able to make their own work-books, thus making it much less expensive for the town to have this necessary material.

The school buildings are in very satisfactory condition. The necessary painting of the interior of the school-rooms has been done so that now the schools rate fully up to Standard as required by the State Board of Education.

May I suggest that additional playground equipment be purchased as soon as possible.

In conclusion, may I express once more my sincere appreciation to the townspeople, members of the school board, and teachers for their earnest support in attempting to maintain good schools.
