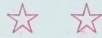

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

*To the Voters of the Town of Huntington:*

Herewith is submitted my ninth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

During the year four elementary schools have been maintained for a period of thirty-five weeks which is the minimum number of weeks required by law. Schools with enrollments are as follows:

<i>School</i>	<i>Enrollment</i>
Catherine Ross, grades 1-4.....	23
Catherine Ross, grades 5-8.....	19
Center, grades 1-8.....	32
Hanksville, grades 1-8.....	14

Attendance has been good in most of the schools. Since the taxpayers are supporting the schools for the benefit of those who have children to educate, parents should allow their children to be absent on account of sickness only. Every session which a child misses means a definite loss of that to which he is entitled.

Parents are to be complimented for the cooperation which they have given in an effort to keep the cost of transportation low. During the year which ended June 30, 1943, \$90.20 was spent for transporting school children. This represents the smallest sum which has been spent for several years.

At the beginning of the present school year, one new teacher was necessary. Miss Mabel Hopkins of Hinesburg was engaged to



fill the vacancy in the Hanksville School made by transferring Miss Mitchell to the Catherine Ross School. With such an acute shortage of teachers, Huntington has been fortunate in securing the services of well-qualified teachers. There is no doubt that it will be more difficult to secure a teaching staff another year unless the present staff can be retained.

In general, the courses of study as previously outlined have been continued. Some new texts in reading have been purchased and many of the books in other subjects have been supplemented with workbooks. These give the pupils the necessary drill to insure progress in their work.

School buildings continue to meet the requirements for standardization. Those repairs which were necessary have been made and any which need attention will be made as time goes on.

I would recommend that every effort be made to maintain your schools at their present high standards of efficiency. In these critical times, we cannot afford to neglect the education of our children. Upon them will rest the responsibilities of continuing our democratic way of living. We should give them the best possible training for the duties which will be theirs to perform.

In conclusion, I desire to express appreciation for your support in the past, and I earnestly solicit your cooperation in the future.

#### OLD AGE ASSISTANCE DEPARTMENT

STATE HOUSE

For the information of your taxpayers and because the program touches every community and a great number of its people, the

customary annual statement is presented for inclusion in your town report.

The Vermont Old Age Assistance Program is in its ninth year of activity. Nearly 11,000 Vermonters have received the benefit of its services and payments. It has proven a dignified and reliable method of relieving uncertainty, distress and need in old age.

To date, about 8½ million dollars has been expended in the State. The number currently receiving assistance is 5,400 persons. This is about 15% of the estimated number of persons over sixty-five years of age. Since the beginning of the program, the entire expense of administration has been 4.2%. The Social Security Board, Washington, D. C., has figures to show that, on a comparable basis, no other state has a better record for efficiency and economy.

Payments of old age assistance to persons applying from your town amounted to \$3,796 during the year January 1, 1943 to December 31, 1943.

The number of recipients in December, 1943, was 20.

The increase in the cost of food, fuel, rents and services constitutes a serious problem to persons dependent on small fixed allowances and has been the cause of much concern to the Old Age Assistance Department.

The advice and counsel of local officials and interested persons has been very valuable, and is gratefully acknowledged by the director, his associates and field staff.

TREASURY DEPARTMENT  
WAR FINANCE COMMITTEE  
FOR VERMONT

*To the People of Huntington:*

Again the time for town meeting has rolled around. Again free men and free women from the hills and valleys of Vermont have an opportunity to express themselves in the most democratic form of government in the world. Again the management of their affairs is completely in their own hands. But again, as in 1942 and 1943, hundreds, yes, thousands, of our young men will not be home to vote. Twenty-seven thousand of them are scattered throughout the battle fronts of the world defending *our* right to vote, and *our* right to manage our own affairs. Whether they must remain at the front another year, and perhaps still another, will depend in a great measure on how well we do our part, and how well we back them up.

Last year, in the two big War Loans—the Second and the Third—Vermont subscribed \$44,000,000 (exclusive of the sale to commercial banks). In the month by month sales, and particularly through the payroll savings plan, Vermonters subscribed an average of a million and a half dollars a month, or \$18,000,000 more, making a total of more than \$70,000,000—an average of about \$200 per person.

Good though this is, we must remember that this is only money loaned at a fair rate of interest; only money loaned to help our soldiers do our bidding; only money loaned from an increased income from industries, mercantile houses and farms. Few of us have made a sacrifice of our comforts, few even of our luxuries.

Let us here in town meeting, where free men gather as they have been gathering in Vermont since 1776, resolve that we will stop at no sacrifice that will get this war over quickly and completely, will return our boys and girls to their homes, will insure a permanent peace.
