SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Last spring we introduced science as a course in the schools of the town. This fall all the grades in all the schools had modern textbooks with facts and experiments to be tried. This was the outgrowth of our findings on tests and the fact that it was one area in which our high school students needed more background. The emphasis is still being continued on math and reading.

Some testing was done in the fall, and some individual special testing has been set for this spring. The purpose of the testing is to help the teachers find the strengths and weaknesses in the scholastic abilities of the children.

There are about five hours in the school day. When many grades divide that time, and numerous subjects subdivide it still further, a teacher finds it difficult to give the special attention that is necessary to be given to children. We have tried to remedy this to some extent this year by dividing the grades among teachers in the lower part of the village. The teachers work conscientiously with groups and individuals in class and project work. Good teachers plus sufficient books, materials and equipment are the ingredients for a good education program for the children. We must continue expenditures for maintaining safe and sanitary repairs at any one time.

Twenty-seven Huntington boys and girls are registered in the high schools of the area. One hundred and three are attending the local grade school.

A public health team from your Vermont Department of Health including a bacteriologist, chemist, dentist, engineer, health educator, public health nurse, nutritionist, physician, psychologist, sanitarian, social worker and statistician is available to aid your health officer, local doctors and other local citizens with such problems.
