## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

In order to provide more teacher-student time in the subjects the schools offer and give individual attention where it is seriously needed at times, parents and townspeople as a whole should not dismiss the possibility of consolidating the schools. The surging public interest in all grades of education has provided the stimulus for raising standards in all schools. High school standards and requirements are being raised because the colleges are demanding more and better preparation. The grade schools will have to prepare students to meet these new demands on the high school level.

The improvements in the physical plants and sanitary facilities which your town made this year deserve commendation. If you plan to continue using your present buildings for a long period in the future you should at least keep up this kind of improvement for the welfare of your boys and girls. There is much to be done to maintain old buildings in safe and sanitary condition. In addition, equipment and furniture should be purchased yearly for a while to replace the old and worn material.

The teachers and I will purchase modern teaching materials and supplies so that your children will have the best that you can afford to better prepare them. Here too we must replace the old and used teaching materials in addition to replenishing the supplies children need to work with.

On the basis of the standardized test results which we have each year, plus teacher-made tests, daily work and class participation, the teachers find the individual differences in students as well as subjects which need more stress. These results help direct our attention toward specific areas which need more time, special materials, or attention for the coming school year. We plan to continue the testing program.

The teachers, students, and townspeople deserve a word of thanks here for the successful drives and money raising programs which you undertake to raise the extra money for encyclopedia sets and instructional equipment for your classes.

#### VERMONT STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH ANNUAL TOWN REPORT, 1959

The health of the town of Huntington is the concern of its citizens, its doctors, health officer, selectmen and the State Department of Health.

Through its various programs the State Department of Health staff works with and for local people on community health, operating on both local and state levels. This letter is a report of the State Health Department services and programs your town used.

With the aim of keeping children well and helping handicapped children, well-child and school conferences were attended by 26 children. At the request of attending doctors + with orthopedic, cardiac, plastic or neurological conditions received services or appliances through clinics for handicapped children.

In the effort to control communicable disease 5 persons received chest X-rays; 30 children received immunizations, including boosters, against diphtheria, whooping cough and/or tetanus. Polio immunizations, including boosters, were given 14 children and adults. The State Laboratory performed tests on 11 water samples, 23 blood specimens and 4 other specimens. Vaccines, anti toxins and biologicals were distributed for protection against communicable diseases.

There were 0 sanitary inspections or consultations made at the town's food and lodging places and 6 concerning water supply, sewage disposal, public buildings and other problems, to protect health through improved town sanitation. Services to maintain and improve adult health in industry included 0 chest X-rays and

inspections and consultations at plants. In connection with the state licensing programs and the Hill-Burton federal aid program for hospital and medical facility construction there were 6 inspections-consultations to hospitals, nursing homes and homes for the aged.

Individual interviews with the psychiatrist, psychologist or psychiatric social worker were given 1\*. Under the community mental health program to develop local projects for prevention, treatment or education in mental health, financial assistance and staff consultations are available.

In cancer work 3 received diagnosis and treatment at tumor clinics, or were financially helped with hospitalization costs.

All programs in the department offer educational services. Pamphlets, films, a news release and information service and speakers are available. A health educator is available to help town groups study their health problems and plan educational programs.

The Public Health nurse, with headquarters in Essex Junction, served at well-child and school conferences, X-ray and immunization clinics, assisted by local people. She visited homes, doctors and agencies, making 169 visits on behalf of 32 persons and community health activities. Her service is an essential element in the department's program for health promotion, disease prevention, diagnosis, treatment and education.

12. Shall the Town vote to request the Volunteer Fire Dept. to submit to the Town Auditors a financial report for each fiscal (commencing Jan. 1, 1960) year? Said report to show all money received, on hand and paid out. Also an inventory of all fire equipment that the Township of Huntington owns.
13. To transact and vote upon any business which may legally come before said Town Meeting.
