## HUNTINGTON SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

School districts in Vermont are constantly facing the problem of providing an education for the youth of their community that will meet the demands of present day society. The demand from industry for unskilled labor has gone down and will continue to do so in the years to come. Machinery is replacing manpower to an

alarming degree. The children in our communities must be trained to a level far exceeding that of the past. How can they hope to be accepted into jobs for which they are not trained? We in Huntington face a particularly difficult situation. Teachers colleges no longer place emphasis on the training of teachers for the one room school especially those having eight grades in one room. Instead their education promotes the one grade per teacher or in many instances departmentalization into the various subject areas. This is in line with the specialization taking place in industry and our schools are forced to keep up with this trend. The effect of the above mentioned procedures create and will continue to create a great scarcity of teachers prepared for or willing to teach in the one room school. Another factor greatly influencing this fact has been the demand for teachers since World War II. They have had the choice of going where they want to teach rather than having to compete for jobs. The job came looking for them. It is a fact right now that it may be impossible to find enough teachers to do the job for next year. The only solution I can see right now would be to make our school situation more attractive to the beginning teacher by having less than the traditional eight grades in the classroom. This makes additional transportation problems, that no one likes, but we might have to face up to it. Eventually it would appear that some kind of school consolidation must take place perhaps involving a new building which would house all of the Huntington Children at one location. We must study this in advance so that we will never face the situation where our schools could not open in September for lack of a teacher.

I wish to acknowledge here the fine work being done by your school directors, teachers and hot lunch workers. They have done many things this year to make your schools better. New furniture and equipment has been purchased. Many repairs have been made and better facilities added. New testing programs have helped your teachers evaluate their work.
