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TOWN MEETING WARNING

The legal voters of the Town of Moretown and the Moretown School District, are hereby warned and notified to meet at the Town Hall in Moretown on Tuesday, March 4, 1941, at ten o'clock A. M. to transact the following business:

ARTICLE 1. To Elect a Moderator.

ARTICLE 2. To Elect a Town Clerk.

ARTICLE 3. To Act on the reports of the several Town and Town School District Officers.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to appoint one or two Road Commissioners.

ARTICLE 5. To elect all necessary Town and Town School District Officers.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to have the taxes on real and personal property paid in installments and to fix the dates of payment of taxes.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to have the taxes paid to the Treasurer or to the Collector of Taxes.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to provide any discounts regarding the payment of said taxes and if so, how much.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to pay the current expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes for that purpose.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town School District will vote to authorize the School Directors to borrow money to pay current expenses of the Town School District in anticipation of taxes for that purpose.

ARTICLE 11. To see how much per cent the Town will vote to raise on the dollar of the grand list of the Town for the year 1941 to pay the current expenses and indebtedness of the Town and State and County taxes.

ARTICLE 12. To see how much per cent the Town School District will vote to raise on the dollar of the grand

list of the Town School District for the year 1941 to pay the current expenses and debts of the Town School District.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to take advantage of the extra \$25.00 per mile granted by No. 101 of the Acts of 1937.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money to take advantage of the State Aid law for resurfacing selected highways.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the selectmen to pay off the 1st mortgage on the J. A. & Eva M. DeLary farm, held by the Northfield Savings Bank, in order to protect the 2nd mortgage which the Town of Moretown now holds. And if the Town so votes will it elect an agent to convey any or all of said farm under the direction of the Selectmen. A deed of said farm will then be in possession of said Town of Moretown.

ARTICLE 16. Shall licenses be granted in this Town for the sale of malt and vinous beverages.

ARTICLE 17. Shall spiritous liquors be sold in this Town.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote for Daylight Saving Time.

ARTICLE 19. To elect two members of the Budget Committee in place of those whose term expires.

ARTICLE 20. To transact any other legal business.

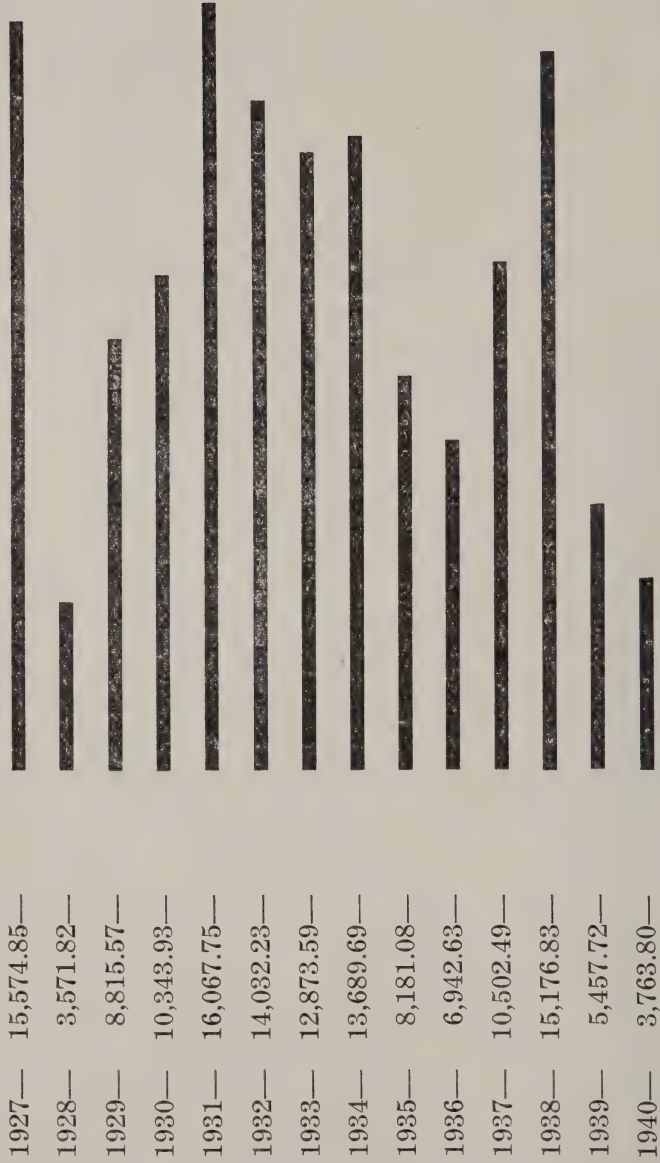

To the Citizens of Moretown:

We are maintaining six schools in Moretown, employing seven teachers, two in the village school and one in each

of the others. The "Town" year and the "School" year are not the same, so to explain the comparative cost of schools note that from February to June, 1940, Flannagan and Taplin were combined, but beginning in September 1940, Taplin was re-opened.

Cox Brook school remained closed this year with Forest Berno transporting his children to the Berlin school. A problem may develop there in that several families have established themselves in Moretown, very close to the Berlin line, also close to the Berlin school. Children of these families have tuition paid by the Moretown school department. The Berlin school board has notified Moretown that the tuition rate will be thirty dollars a year per pupil as against a previous thirty-five dollars.

The Village school has had the inside walls thoroughly washed and the furnace overhauled. New swing hangers and chains were placed on the playground. There are 21 pupils in the Grammar room and 33 in the Primary room.

The Flannagan and Taplin schools continued as one school until June. In the summer the swings were repaired as at the Village school. In September it seemed better to re-open the Taplin school and these schools are now running separately. There are 13 pupils in the Flanagan school.

The Taplin school was hurriedly opened in September but the arrangement seems satisfactory. There should be considerable repair work done on the Taplin school during the summer. There are 12 pupils in the Taplin school.

The Jones Brook school has 21 pupils. Swings were added to the playground there. The school board realizes there are unnecessary damages to this school, probably because the pupils come from greater distances than in the other schools. They are trying to keep the school in repair. New grates have been put in the stove. The inside was varnished.

The Common school is in good condition. It was varnished and painted inside and the swings repaired. The School now has six pupils, two of whom graduate in June. The School Board realizes the value of this school as a Community Center and hopes it will remain that; but unless there are other families move in, would recommend the four pupils left next September be brought to the Village School.

The Rockbridge school continues to be one of our largest schools with 35 pupils. The building is in good condition. The surplus pupils of this district are placed in Duxbury and Waterbury as last year. In accordance with the State Law of 1935 No. 91, which permits a local School Board to expend not more than three percent of a current year's budget on health service, the School Board allowed Rockbridge \$10 toward a dental project. Also it allowed \$10 toward tonsil operations for Moretown children attending the Duxbury Corner school.

The High School tuition continues about the same as last year. Notice has been received from Montpelier that beginning the school year 1941-1942, Montpelier High School tuition will be \$80.00 per year. The Town only pays \$75.00 a year on any one pupil for not more than four years.

The School Board has tried to adjust school problems as well as possible. The situation of most of the schools on much travelled highways offer new problems. Possible bills before the present Legislature may likewise present new problems.

The School Board welcomes suggestions and criticism that will improve the efficiency of that Board.

The School Board wishes to thank the townspeople, teachers and pupils for their cooperation in the past year.

To the Voters of Moretown—

As your superintendent of schools, I wish to report good progress during the year. Your teachers have been faithful and loyal. The criticisms you parents have made—justly or unjustly—have all received careful consideration and fair adjustment made to the best of my ability.

A new set of spelling books have been placed in each grade, beginning with the third, and have been enjoyed by the students. They have been found very satisfactory, also, by the teachers.

The Rugg books have been replaced by another text. These have been replaced not because I agree with the unfavorable criticism given them by the press, but because I doubt if any one person is capable of defending any book.

Another year I would like to introduce a more modern reader. The one to which I refer has been used in another town in my district, and has been found very satisfactory.

A gradual reduction in school population in parts of the town will require some adjustments. Some school may have to be closed and transportation provided where necessary. These problems cannot be foreseen, but will have to be treated as they develop.

The opening of the Taplin school removed a problem in transportation that has never been entirely satisfactory. This school is the only one in town not standardized, and it might be best to leave that matter until we are sure that there will be enough children to warrant keeping it open.

This past year children living near the Duxbury Corner have been accommodated at the Duxbury Corner school. This arrangement is mutually advantageous, and should be continued.

What has been accomplished has been possible only through the cooperation of school board, teachers and townspeople.

BUDGET COMMITTEE REPORT

The attendance of the representative town officers at the Monthly Meetings has been very encouraging and reveals the fact that we are fortunate in having officials who are earnestly endeavoring to cooperate with each other to the end that this town may be operated in an efficient and satisfactory manner. The direct value of the Budget Committee to the town is dependent upon this cooperation.

Satisfactory and efficient management of the Poor Department has become such a technical and legal problem in some towns that the voters have decided to place this responsibility in the hands of the Board of Selectmen giving them the privilege of operating the Overseer's Department themselves or appointing someone for whom they would be directly responsible. With absolutely no reflection on the endeavors of the present Overseer we would like to see and recommend that this system be tried out for a year or two.
